Actually, any of these qualities would represent a tremendous improvement.

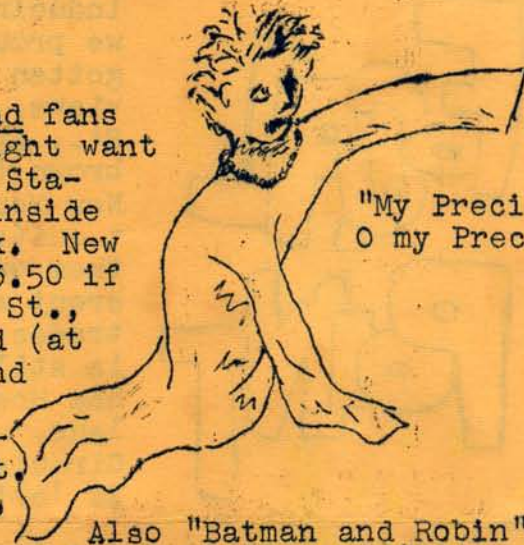
